It became weathered and broken and ended up in a corner of basement. Son, Walter Green took it home and restored it. He then gave the rocker to his brother George.

George and Audrey Green became Johnston residents in 1953. Audrey still belongs to the Fruitland Brennan League of Johnston.

Rocker donated to the museum by the children of Walter and Gertrude Green.
