- 3. Continue to encourage the City of Johnston to create a Historic Preservation Commission.
- 4. Evaluate how to digitize the JSHS document and photo collection and make it accessible on-line.
- 5. Reopen the 1902 Simpson House, once the pandemic passes.

1902 Simpson House Museum Access:

We hope to reopen the museum in 2021 and want to provide that experience to all who are interested. 2020 was the 30th anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), which ensured reasonable equal access to persons with limited mobility, limited vision, limited hearing, and other disabilities. The 1902 Simpson House Museum has a access ramp on the North side and the North porch door allows wheelchair access. The first floor of the museum has sufficient room for wheelchair access to all of the artifacts in the rooms that are open to the public.

While it is not possible to remove some barriers to accessibility to the 2nd floor exhibit rooms, because the required alterations would reduce or destroy the significance of our historic facility, volunteers can provide alternative methods of access. Since the second floor of our historic house museum can only be reached by climbing stairs, volunteers can provide notebooks of photographs and a video that depicts the items, space and information shown on the second floor to a person who is unable to climb the stairs. Those photographs and video are in an accessible first floor location. This permits people with a mobility disability to obtain information about the items and space on the upper level that others obtain who are able to climb the stairs. Also, the research items, like the extensive collection of family histories, can be brought down to the first floor for easy access.
