# **Archives Inventory and Digitization Project**

A second summer intern will continue the work to update our inventory spreadsheet, noting what artifacts should be retained, need better preservation or should be considered for deaccession (donation or sale). She will be assisted by Johnston High School volunteers and JSHS member volunteers.

Once that inventory is completed, the artifact list, along with pictures, photo and documents scanned images will be publicly available on-line using our website or the Johnston Library website. We thank Prairie Meadows and State Historical Society of Iowa, Inc. for funding this project.

The Upstairs research room has moved to the first floor office room, to facilitate member history and genealogical research. Automating many of our office functions has allowed JSHS to consolidate its two former office rooms. A new exhibit will be created for the former upstairs research room.

## Kites of the Green Open House Saturday, May 7th

Johnston Historical Society held an open house during the Kites on the Green events May 7th. We were pleased to have visitors who toured our beautiful 1902 Simpson House Museum.

Children played the Simpson House Bingo, where they have a bingo sheet with 25 pictures of items in the house. They go through the house and try to find all the pictures on their sheet. Also, the Metsons found pictures of their family members in the high school room. They found pictures in both year books and class pictures. Cookies, coffee and lemonade were enjoyed by our guests

We are grateful to the volunteers that helped give tours of the 1902 Simpson House Museum. We were able to be open all 7 hours of the event. A constant stream of over 200 visitors, young and old, toured the house. Thanks to the City of Johnston for publicizing the event.

The producer liked the layout, woodwork and floors of the 1902 Simpson House and his film production company joined the Johnston Historical Society as a business member. # Ben Dewey Park Renovation and Historical Marker

This newsletter has recently included articles about Ben Dewey, who was a founder of the Johnston School District and a long-time Polk County Board member. He really helped shape and create Johnston as we know it today. He also helped create the city park that is now known as Dewey Park.

The City plans to renovate the shelters, restroom and playground equipment at that park. That created an opportunity to buy and install a historical marker describing the fascinating life of the park's namesake. A Polk County Community Betterment grant application has been approved by the Board of Supervisors. The grant will be used to purchase a two-sided historical marker about Ben Dewey, and a marker post, to be installed by the City at the park. The marker will include a one paragraph description of his life, and a QR code box. Using a smartphone, that can be used to get more details about his life on the JSHS site.
